**2023 Budget Survey** 



## BUDGET SURVEY Overview

The Town of Lamont hosted the **2023 Budget Survey** to gather information and feedback regarding services to support municipal budget planning for 2023.

The survey was available (online and hard copy) from Aug 9, 2022 to September 30, 2022.
81 submissions were received online and one hard copy.

Based on the data findings, over half of the taxpayers (55%) have a good understanding of how municipal budgets are prepared and applied

Ratepayers were asked about the type of new amenities and infrastructure that they want to see in the Town of Lamont and where one would choose to allocate additional funds, and if they support a tax increase.

Respondents were given the opportunity to share feedback through open-ended questions.

Based on the survey data collected, ratepayers rank the improvement of roads and alleys as their number one priority, with Protective Services second and Water and Wastewater Services, Recreational Services and Economic Development scoring very close in third place.



The results are contained in the following report.

The Town contracted a third-party vendor to design, conduct and report on the survey data and participation was voluntary, and responses are anonymous and kept strictly confidential.

## RESPONDENT DEMOGRAPHICS

While responses were kept strictly confidential and the results of the survey will not be used in any way that will allow anyone to be identified, the Town asked for some basic demographic information as part of the survey. For example, 90% of respondents indicated they own their home and the following shows the ages of the participants.

Protective Services 63.7%
Water & Wastewater Services 51.2%
Recreational Services 50%
Economic Development 48.8%
Community Services 47.5%
Parks & Green Spaces 45%
Garbage & Recycling 38.8%
General Government & Administration 30%
Land Development Services 18.8%

12.5% ARE UNSURE

## MUNICIPAL BUDGETS & SERVICE LEVELS

**37.5%** Prefer tax increases that maintain existing municipal services and allow for new investments

**37.5%** Prefer the same or lower taxes even if this results in reduced municipal services

**13.8%** Prefer tax increases that maintain current municipal service levels, while the remaining 12.5% of Respondents are unsure.




#### Are you a Town of Lamont resident or business owner?




#### Do you support a tax increase to support new amenities and/or infrastructure?


#### Maintaining, growing, and attracting business in the Town of Lamont

#### In which age category to you fall?


